



Sec 6 : Effect of Repeal

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Note: "REPEAL" means complete obliteration of the old Statute, as if it never existed!

Sec 6 : Effect of Repeal

① Repeal cannot revive the earlier law, which is not in force.

Ex- Repeal of Co. Act 1956 **cannot revive** Co. Act 1913.

- ② Prior operation of old law
(ex:-incorporation)
- ③ Any rights/ Liabilities under old law
- ④ Any punishment

The purpose of Sec-7 is to save time in drafting new law.

14	<p>If any power is conferred upon an Authority (functionary) by Central Law, then that power can be exercised by that Authority from time to time.</p> <p><u>Ex:-</u> Sec 469 of Co. Act 2013 confers power on CG (MCA) to make Rules. MCA can make Rules "from time to time".</p>
15	<p>If a Central Act confers power on an Authority (functionary) to make "appointments" in Govt position, then the Authority can appoint by:- Siddharth Agarwal</p> <p>(i) Name or, (fresh appt) (ii) Virtue of Existing office. (ex-officio appt)</p>
16	<p>Power to "appoint" under a Central Act includes the power to :-</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> i) Suspend ii) dismiss <p>Siddharth Agarwal</p> <p><u>Ex:-</u> Chief Justice has power to APPOINT officers in High Court, by virtue of Constitution. This power also includes the power to :- Suspend <u>or</u> dismiss the officers.</p>
